### Round Seven Review

Rockingham City lost their spot at the top of the All Flags Division Two table after they were beaten 3-2 by Balga at Lark Hill. The home side were ahead 2-0 just after the break with goals from Ryan Kennedy and Gershom Rowland. But Balga then hit back. They pulled one back on 70 minutes, Jimmy Taneski ran clear and finished low past Cyril Sharrock. Then with five minutes remaining Balga levelled. Dinko Ahmetanovic free kick crashed off the cross bar, and from the resulting goalmouth scramble, Lee James fired home. But in the final minute, Balga completed a stunning comeback with the winner. Taneski's free kick found Ahmetanovic in space, and his neat volley flew into the net to set off wild celebrations from players and supporters alike. "It was a unbelievable performance after a timid first half," said Balga keeper Ollie Rigler. "The team spirit was something I haven't been involved in since playing in England. On the pitch they are a brilliant team but we had too much fight and found their weakness and exploited them well."

Forrestfield United moved into top spot on goal difference after thrashing Kelmscott Roos 10-0 at Hartfield Park. Ben Rogers scored four, Rhys Loxley a hat-trick with singles to Nathan Watkins, Scott Barker and Trent Wood. Melville City are back in the winner's circle after a hard fought 2-1 win against Curtin University at Len Shearer Reserve. The visitors had the chance to take the lead on 11 minutes, but Jon Krawec's penalty was well saved by Mirko Grgurinovic. But on the half hour Curtin opened the scoring, Robert Keegan getting on the end of Khaled Salhah's cross. But before the break Melville levelled, Matt Donley was given far too much space and he fired home. The winner for the home side came 10 minutes from time, with Simon El Chami headed home from a corner. "Very pleased to get three points against a team that is better than their results suggest," said Melville coach Gavin Brown. "After last week's disappointment we needed a big performance and to come back from a goal down showed bottle and fighting spirit."

In other games Kingsway Olympic beat Ellenbrook United 1-0 at Arbor Grove Reserve, with Nathan Thorpe scoring the winner, while Joondalup City thrashed Fremantle City 5-1 at Iluka Sport Complex. In the final game Wanneroo City won the local derby 3-1 against Quinns at Wanneroo Reserve. The home side were ahead when John Monterosso went through one-on-one with Quinns keeper Adam Bowers and scored. Connor Lynch added a second after a good work from Monterosso on the right, before Scott Campbell played in Lynch to add his second. "We played exceptionally well today. We had a plan and the boys stuck to it for 90 minutes," Wanneroo Coach Matt Debarro said. "Quinns are a tough team to play against credit to them and there coaching staff they will do well this season but I think today we were focused and to well organised."

### UNDER 18'S MATCH REPORT

Balga vs Joondalup City - 23/5/2015

The match kicked off in polar opposite conditions to the previous week's encounter with lovely sunshine & hardly any breeze, perfect conditions for a game of football.

Unfortunately for Balga when the game started the lads still had their heads in the change room as Joondalup City took the lead after 30 seconds following a mix up at the back. Joondalup City didn't have to wait long to double their lead against the run of play in the 5th minute. To make things worse for Balga we were forced to make an early substitute as Blue Doe Soe Hai had to come off in the 9th minute with an ankle injury being replaced by Samson Araya. Joondalup City then took full advantage of the situation by slotting home their 3rd goal of the half in the 16th minute.

The next passage of play was very even with Balga starting to work their way back into the match & were rewarded for their good football with a goal in the 25th minute to James Razua Bawi, bringing the score to 3-1. For the duration of the 1st half the match ebbed & flowed with both teams playing attractive attacking football although neither side could add to the score before half time.

As the 2nd half gets underway it's Balga who have come out with more intensity, looking to reduce the gap on the scoreboard. In the 53rd minute Jacob O'Halloran sees his free kick come close but not close enough after a constant spell of pressure. This close call is soon followed by a shot from Najib Rahimi in the 57th minute which also comes close to closing the gap. In the 60th minute Abdull Ali was replaced by Ahmed Mohamed. In the 69th minute Joondalup City score their 4th goal of the match which was very much against the run of play. In the 73rd minute Nattawut (Singto) Thongngam was replaced by Abdullahi Nuhr. For the remainder of the match it was once again a titanic battle between two teams who wanted to play good attractive football.

At the final whistle it was Joondalup City who took the 3 points with a 4-1 victory. Both sets of coaches, officials & supporters said it was one the better games they had seen at this level which is a great compliment to both clubs. After the first 15 minutes it was a very even game of football with the difference being Joondalup City took their chances when they came up. Congratulations to both teams on what was an extremely entertaining match.

If we can keep up the standard of the last 75 minutes of this match our first win of the season is only just around the corner. I firmly believe once we get this we will go on to win 5 or 6 in a row.

### Our Opponents



Melville City Soccer Club was formed in 1969 and played all their home games at Tompkins Park in Applecross. The club moved to their current home venue at Len Shearer Reserve in the early 1980's, with junior soccer being the main focus of the club. Melville City went on to become one of the biggest junior clubs in Western Australia.

In 2011, amateur league heavyweight Murdoch University completed a merger with Melville City after Murdoch had played at Len Shearer Reserve for a few seasons prior to both clubs joining forces. Murdoch had won the Amateur Premier Division title in 1999 and won the Amateur Cup in 2000. The club also made it to two further Amateur Cup finals in 2002 and 2009.

As Melville City, the team finished runners-up in the 2011 Amateur Premier Division, in which the club successfully applied to join the State League Second Division the following year. Since their time in the State League, Melville has finished 4th in 2012, 6th in 2013 and 5th in 2014.

# Round Six Review

Rockingham City have maintained their lead at the top of the All Flags Division Two table after a 5-1 win against Curtin University at Raphael Park. The home side were ahead after only four minutes, Khaled Salhah heading home Carlo Chiellini's cross, giving Cyril Sharrock no chance in the Rockingham goal. But the visitors were level moments later Ryan Kennedy's through ball sent Alex Grayson clear and he finished low past Mackenzie Ferguson. Rockingham were ahead on the half hour, Kennedy's free kick from the edge of the penalty area flew into the net. The home side then had new signing Robbie Nicholl sent off after receiving his second yellow card, and Rockingham took advantage scoring two more before half time. Rockingham lost Monty Grigo with a bad knee injury midway through the half, but they continued to dominate, and it was Kennedy again; who was the supplier was for the third. His set piece was spilled by Ferguson and Grayson was on hand to add his second from close-range. Then before the break Kennedy's free kick was volleyed home by Max Snelson from close-range. Curtin regrouped at the break and Nathan Smith went close, before Dilip Thapa fired wide. But Rockingham added their fifth when David Clark was picked out by new signing Calum Rothwell to fire home from the edge of the penalty area.

In other games, Wanneroo City won a ten goal thriller against Kelmscott Roos at Frye Park. John Monterosso scored a hat trick, with Daniel Coletta, Thomas Black, Connor Lynch and Josh Beddis were on target for City.. Joondalup City best Balga 5-3 at Princess Road Reserve. The home side were in the driving seat and led 3-0 at the break. Lee James opened the scoring firing home Nahom Michael's cut back in the opening minute, and it was 2-0 10 minutes later, with Kyall Osbourne firing home. Jimmy Taneski added the third before the break, finishing clinically after good work from Michael again. But the second half was a disaster for Balga, with Alex Corner, a Bobby Irving penalty, Ryan Burgess and a brace from Liam Peacock gave City a stunning comeback victory. Forrestfield United beat Kingsway Olympic 2-1 at the Kingsway Reserve. Rhys Loxley scored both United's goals, while David Gordan scored for Olympic. Fremantle United thrashed bottom of the table Ellenbrook United 5-0 at Hilton Reserve, with Danny Clapham scoring four goals, Andrew Morrow a brace and Domenic Mann added the other on his first start with the senior team. In the final game Quinns Fc got back to winning ways with a 2-1 win against Melville City at Gumblossom Reserve.

# FLASHBACK

1979

It was only Balga's second season in the semi-professional competition after joining the Soccer Federation in 1978. In 1978 the club was one of the favourites for promotion, however disappointingly Balga finished fifth and well short of promotion in the newly created Fourth Division.

In 1979 Balga were determined to go all the way, and coach Dave Clarkson brought in several new players to help the club push for honours. During the season Balga were on the way to their target, and looked likely to win the title. However two losses to Bunbury City, including a 4-0 trouncing in the final game meant Balga had to settle for second place. Though with two going up, Balga were promoted to the third tier of WA football in 1980.

Balga's leading scorers in 1979 was S. Lewis with 13 goals and P. Wade who scored 10.
