OUR GUESTS



Kalamunda City have a complex history made up of mergers, name changes and partnerships.

Maddington White City formed a partnership with Kalamunda United last season before fully merging late last year to become "Kalamunda City".

The Maddington part of the club was founded in 1980 as Booragoon Zavicaj. It entered the Amateur League Fourth Division the following year where it finished third before deciding to enter the semi-professional league in 1982.

The club stayed in the semi-professional league for ten seasons, where it yo-yoed between the third and fourth tiers. During 1991, Zavicaj decided to merge with Dianella Serbia.

Later in the 1990's, the two clubs decided to go their own way, with former Zavicaj members buying land in Maddington, where the new Serbian Community Centre was constructed in 2000. With football pitches behind the new centre ready to go, it was decided to re-form the team, which would now go under the name of Maddington Eagles. The club finished third in the Amateur Fourth Division in their first season back in 2007.

Maddington slowly made their way up the leagues, and by 2012 were in the Amateur Second Division. Also that season, Fremantle Spirit of the State League (Formerly Fremantle Benfica) would play some of their home games at Maddington's ground. During the following summer, the Fremantle Spirit committee decided to join with the Maddington Eagles, with the new look club to be called Maddington White City.





For the first time since 1991, Maddington was now back in the State League, while their Sunday team continued in the Amateurs. However, it was only to last one season, when at the end of 2013, the club was controversially removed from the State League by Football West.

Their amateur team continued on, and by 2020 had made it to the Amateur Premier Division, where they finished fourth. In 2021, Maddington just missed out on the championship finishing second to South West Phoenix. However, the following year the club made no mistake, won the title and were back in the State League!

Just after the season had been completed, the club decided to join forces with Kalamunda United. The new partnership would be called Maddington-Kalamunda White City. Kalamunda United had been formed in 1969. They were known for many years as Wycombe Wanderers before changing to Kalamunda United in the late 1990's. Since 2002, the team had played between the Third and First Divisions, but could never quite make the Amateur Premier. Kalamunda United applied to join the State League in 2014 when Division Two was expanded, but their application was not successful.

After the new joint venture with Maddington last year, both clubs decided to fully merge to be now known as Kalamunda City, while still playing at what was United's home ground at Maida Vale Reserve.

Balga have only ever played Maddington-Kalamunda White City twice, which was last season. Balga winning at home 2-0, before Maddington won at Maida Vale Reserve 1-0.

In the 1980's, Balga and Booragoon Zavicaj (the former name of Maddington) were never in the same league. They did however come up against Fremantle Benfica, who ended up joining with Maddington in 2013. In those six games, Balga lost five and only drew one.

Today will be the first time we will play the club now known as Kalamunda City.

BALGA VS CANNING CITY - ROUND 3

Balga SC have fought back from two-goals down with nine minutes to play, to beat Canning City 3-2 in our State League Division Two 'Match of the Round' at Burrendah Park on Saturday afternoon. "I thought we were unfortunate not to score in the first half, creating a number of chances but not managing to put the ball in the net. We knew we weren't at our best at times and credit to Canning, they capitalised on this, and we were 0-2 down," Balga's Cian Guest said.

"It takes a lot of trust in the players and the tactics to continue with the same game plan, but we came out in the second half and persisted with working the ball wide and delivering it in. A great finish for our first goal gave us the confidence to push on. With a few players missing this week, we had to approach the game differently and this worked in our advantage to use the pace up front to get in the box and eventually win a penalty. The same can be said for the goal that gave us the win. Without the height in the box, we knew set pieces would need to be followed up, and fortunately this eventually paid off. Overall, it showed our desire to win is there this season and was great to come away with three points."

It was the hosts who began the game well, but Balga lifted and were unlucky not to take the lead, but eight minutes before the break it was Canning who found the opener. A quick break saw Ishmael Greywood race clear and superbly fired home from distance. They added a second 12 minutes into the second half, with Tom Kinnane was brought down in the box, and he picked himself up to convert the penalty. It looked like the points were safe, but Gerhard Janssen's side had other ideas and pulled one back nine minutes from time Valentin Dosiere curling home from the edge of the box. They found the equaliser four minutes later, Alessio Meschi sending Jordan Jones the wrong way from the spot.

The momentum was now with the visitors and in the final minute Balga found the winner. Meschi's free kick was parried by Jones and substitute Nicholas Bahr-Pike was on hand to fire home the rebound. "We were missing a few today and that showed, we struggled in the first half to play and we were lucky to go in 1-0 after a great finish by Ishmael," Canning head coach Lee Hayward said. "The second half was a little more even but we made a few forced changes which upset the shape and to Balga credit they punished us late on. Similar to last week we struggled to play for 90 minutes and today it cost us, it's a very young team and we will need to learn from it quickly."
